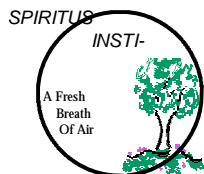

## Directions to the Whidbey Institute



1. Drive N from Seattle on I-5 toward Vancouver BC.
2. Merge onto WA-525 N via Exit 182 toward WA-99
3. WA-525 becomes the MUKILTEO-CLINTON FERRY (Check ferry schedules and fares as the drive from the ferry to the Whidbey Institute takes about 20 minutes).
4. When the ferry docks on the Clinton side stay on WA-525 and turn L onto CAMPBELL ROAD.
5. Follow Campbell Road to OLD PIETILA ROAD and turn L again.
6. The WHIDBEY INSTITUTE is located at 6390 OLD PIETILA ROAD.

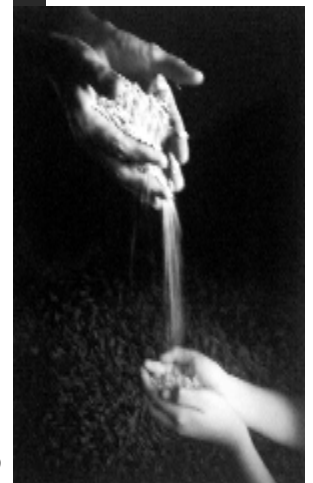
## Mission of Spiritus Institute

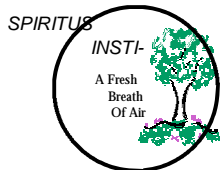
The mission of the Spiritus Institute is to provide doctoral level education of distinctive excellence which fosters an integration of psychology and spirituality with the whole person of the healing professional.

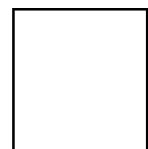
